 - You will also find daily schedules with creative breaks and recommendations to keep kids engaged and exploring, one day (or one hour) at a time.



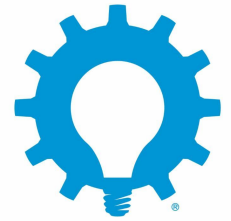
Meeting the Needs of Diverse Learners

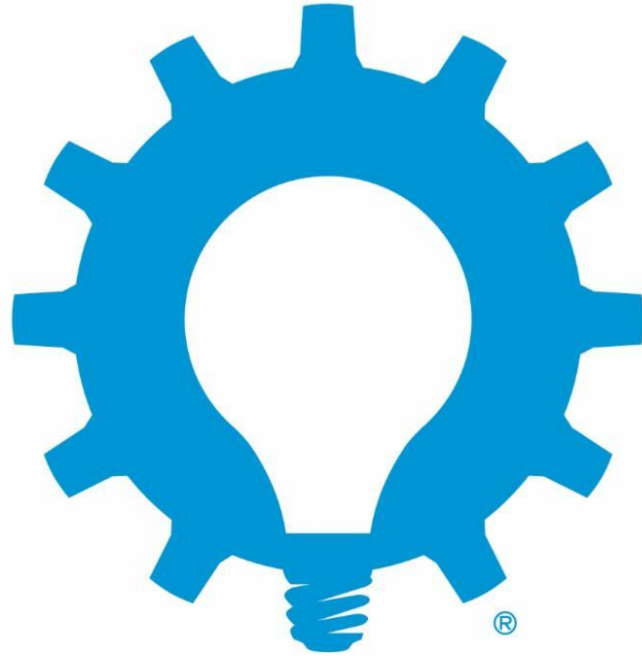
